From The Moderator

To everything there is a season (for details, see Ecclesiastes). Old South is now entering into its season of rest and renewal. Some might find it odd that we go relatively dormant during summer, a time when Nature is riotously exuberant. But it's our tradition, and questioning tradition can lead to trouble (for details, see the Gospels).

Although there won't be much in the way of committee meetings between now and September, there will still be activity. The stuff I'm particularly focused on is, of course, the work related to moving the homeless shelter into HMH. An Auburn architect, Bill Hamilton, has visited five times and has almost finished making detailed measurements of all the rooms in the house. (The original blueprints listed no dimensions. They did, however, list the presence of a "billiards room," which immediately made me think of Colonel Mustard with the candlestick.) Bill will soon be meeting with code enforcement authorities to discuss the options, and then with us and with folks from the shelter's board to discuss further and to draw up a code compliance plan. In the meantime, a panel from the shelter and Old South will present the shelter project to local businesses on May 30 and then answer people's questions. My hope is that the shelter will be in HMH well before September. We'll keep you posted.

Actually I wasn't quite truthful about the lack of committee meetings: the Pastoral Search Committee will be considering potential settled pastors on our behalf. Think kindly of the committee members during your carefree summer hours.

I'm also aware that there will be some activities for children and youth this summer, including a four-day Vacation Bible School. I'm reminded of this because I'm writing these words on Children's Sunday, and viewing this morning's slide presentations showing all of the kids' activities – or rather, ministries – gave me a powerful sense that here is a perfect distillation of Christianity. I'm hopeful for the Church's future with such young people, and grateful that we have dedicated adults to guide them.

I hope you find time to relax, recuperate, rejuvenate, and rejoice this summer. For myself it's been a hectic five months, so I'm hoping to hike, to kayak, and to do some utterly unproductive lounging on my front porch, with the excuse that God mandates a Sabbath (for details, see Genesis).

Things are moving forward with the Capital Campaign and by the time you read this, all of the accessibility updates should be completed. That being said, I would like to offer my sincere gratitude to our Property Trustees for all of their hard work. They give their time and energy to make sure our church is warm in the winter and that all of the maintenance is up to speed. Thank you all so much!!

I hope everyone has a wonderful summer. There will be many things in the works around Old South in the coming months with our search for settled pastor and our rental agreement with the homeless shelter. Please know that all of those involved will do their best to keep everyone up to speed as things unfold.

As of May 21, our current income is \$105,286 and our expenses are \$90,855. Keep in mind that we receive investment income quarterly now instead of monthly. Our account receives distributions in January, April, July, and October.

*Please note: 1st Quarter withdrawals differed from our standard withdrawal because the Maine UCC Funds mailed us our earned income for 4th Quarter 2017 rather than reinvesting. These amounts were applied against our regular quarterly withdrawal amounts of \$14,777.55 (Endowment) and \$4,298.46 (Holman Trust). For June 30th and September 30th, our withdrawals will be the standard amounts. In December 2018, we will withdraw our new amount for 2019.

We are just shy of our stewardship goal for 2018. To date we have pledges in the amount of \$118,984. Our goal was \$120,000. Currently, \$128,400 has been pledged and \$80,365 given. Please submit your second-year campaign pledge amount as soon as possible so that we are able to begin this second project. Deacons' Corner

SPRING!

There are some small trees that grow along the side of my road which are beautiful in the late fall and early spring. While almost all the other trees are bare-limbed, these keep their leaves all winter long. In the sparseness of the cold season, the leaves are bleached and paper-thin. They rattle in the wind and catch the sunlight.

The leaves hang on tight right into the spring time, even as the trees begin to bud. On a recent walk, I stopped to see how the buds were coming along and I noticed that, suddenly, the old leaves were all gone! I'm not sure why these trees keep their old leaves all winter and shed them only when the leaf buds appear, but it seems likely that it's all part of a plan.

Witnessing this seasonal cycle reminded me of a course of events that has unfolded in the Diaconate this spring.



Deacons' Corner continued

Ever since I joined the Diaconate in 2014, we have been talking about how we can "tweek" the "flocks" to make them easier to work with and more responsive to the needs of the congregation. They were first established as a way of helping Old South parishioners know that they were connected to and cared for by the church. Each parishioner was assigned to a deacon who served as a contact person and a source of assistance during times of need. The "flocks" worked well for a while, but, in recent years, the real-life application of this idea has become more challenging. Over time, the size of Old South's extended family has continued to grow and the Diaconate has shrunk. Currently, each deacon has 15-19 people in his/her deacon group (our new name for the "flock"). If you haven't been hearing from your deacon lately, that's why: the deacon groups have simply become too large to keep up with!

After numerous discussions and no clear answers about how we might fix this problem, Pastor Linda encouraged us to put the deacon groups on hold for now. She suggested that, when faced with a complex issue, sometimes one just has to go back to the beginning and start anew, to let go of the old so that the new buds can begin to grow.

That is what we have decided to do. For the near future, instead of deacon groups, the deacons will respond collectively to concerns and needs in the congregation. We still want to hear from you! Please contact any deacon, they will communicate your request or comment to the Diaconate as a whole and we will respond to you. If you have a concern that you would like to keep confidential, please talk to me as the Diaconate chairperson. We are no less committed to serving our church family in any way that we can!

Just like the budding trees, our church has travelled across the seasons and we are now on the brink of a new time: the arrival of our next settled pastor. Who knows what new growth this next season will bring to our life together as a church family? One thing is for sure: the old and the new are all part of the plan!

Strawberry Shortcake -A Berry Good Tradition

Since the Pierce House celebrated its grand 100-year anniversary in 2005, it has been the tradition for Old South First Congregational Church to serve up strawberry shortcake there on July 4th. Most years, volunteers from Old South pick the berries fresh from David and Verna Pike's farm on the Whittier Road. Volunteer pickers gather in the morning and harvest the red ripe berries. Boxes of picked berries are then transported to the Old South kitchen where another group of volunteers wash, hull and mash the strawberries adding just the right amount of sugar. Each year the Pikes have supported the annual strawberry shortcake event by donating a generous portion of the cost of the berries.

Early on the morning of the 4th, approximately 300 biscuits are baked in the church's kitchen. Once the biscuits are baked, all the ingredients and supplies are taken to the Pierce House and the serving area is set up under a tent on the Pierce House front lawn. Each year there is someone wanting their shortcake before the setup is complete! Volunteers staff the assembly line, making each shortcake as perfect as possible with a fresh baked biscuit, a generous scoop of Pikes' locally grown fresh strawberries and a generous squirt of whipped cream. Serving begins at 10:30 am and goes until 12:30 pm, or until the berries, or biscuits, run out before then. The cost for a serving will remain the same as last year at \$4.00 each. Proceeds from the sale of the strawberries will benefit community service, outreach, youth programs and ongoing Capital Campaign projects. FMI-207-778-0424
