We mark the milestones of the beginning and ends of the path on the map or the highlights on the calendar, but there are lessons and relationship that continue our spiritual growth on an ongoing basis. What a great joy to begin the program year with Old South. I look forward to rejoining you on the path when I return from Spain.

From The Moderator

At the start of a new program year I find it instructive to review what happened at Old South during the past twelve months. Some of it was joyous, some it was frustrating, so I guess "instructive" is as good an adjective as any for describing the whole.

When I composed last September's article we were still looking for a settled pastor. That search was completed not long afterwards – and it was a rousing success, don't you agree?

It's tempting to stop right there on a high note, but in the interest of balance I'll point out that a year ago there was only a vague notion, held by a very few in the congregation, that we had a very few pigeons that needed to be evicted. It turned out that we were underestimating the number of animals and the number of species. Yet we finally got rid of our numerous flying guests and their numerous, um, calling cards, even if it took until just a few weeks ago to complete the task.

Members have come, members have gone. The Property Trustees fixed old problems, and new ones cropped up. Several members put in the time and effort to apply for new funding to repair an old stained glass window, and there's another grant application to come this fall. Our ministries have thrived, but we won't have the homeless shelter in the Holman Mission House. We've already started to investigate other potential uses for HMH, and on September 29 we'll have an Our Turn discussion on that subject. Nor is that the only major item on this year's agenda, for at our May annual meeting we suggested creating a columbarium, a concept that will be fleshed out and further discussed in the months ahead.

The phrase that comes to mind to describe last year, and my expectations for the coming year, is "in flux." That's just how it goes in the 21st-century church, I suspect. Would it be better if everything were settled, secure, and sedate? Better for my stress levels, perhaps; but probably not terribly interesting or terribly conducive to personal / spiritual growth.

It also wouldn't require us to work together, and that would be an enormous loss, for we have worked on remarkable things together. Last year we were bold in the service of God. My favorite novel, Mikhail Bulgakov's *The Master and Margarita*, tells us that "cowardice is the worst sin of all." Bulgakov was nominally referring to the moral cowardice of Pontius Pilate, and in reality talking about his own society under Stalin – but the sentiment is timeless. Well, we were guilty of no such sin last year, and I look forward to another year of speaking up for our faith, though we be in flux with multiple concerns and multiple projects. My prediction is that some of it will be joyous, some of it will be frustrating, and all of it will be instructive.

From the Treasurer

As I write this, Mary and I just returned from being out of town. I've only called Maine "home" for a few years, but I have to say there is something about coming back to this great state after being away even for a few days. At one point Mary asked me if I was okay because I kept taking these really deep breaths and I said, "Yeah! It's just good to breathe in this air!" Likewise, when my mother visited in June, she commented that people in Maine seemed different...as in happier. I said, "Yeah, it's the fresh air."

Anyway, much has happened over the summer and I won't recap those things because I know they will be covered elsewhere. That being said, we are always in need of financial support. Our building is beautiful but isn't what it used to be. As it ages, it finds itself in need of more and more repairs. These are difficult conversations we will inevitably find ourselves in having in the near future. But for now, continue to enjoy Maine's beautiful summer as it comes to a close.

As of the printing of the Telstar, our year to date income is \$154,205.83 and our expenses are \$158,371.90.






Acolytes: Carrying the Light of God into the Sanctuary

From the Property Trustees

Summer finally arrived and seemed to go into full activity mode quickly.

The young crab-apple, planted in the memory of Kären Williams Jordan and donated by her family, took hold well and bloomed gloriously!

Our children and choir took well deserved vacations but were much missed. Though at the same time, we hope they enjoyed their break.

All American Wildlife Control has completed their work and our young female hawk discovered in the church during the work has taken up residence nearby to continue to assist in pest control.

Some of the Property Trustees have begun requesting bids and estimates for metal and shingle roofing for the original church building. The reason for this is several people have noted and brought to our attention shingles torn from the roof or simply missing after snow melt and have voiced concerns regarding the new insulation being damaged by leakage.

We are also asking for updated bids for four components of the next step (repair brickwork on the church's north face) in the Capital Campaign prioritized list of projects. The work would entail four components: all mortar joints must be inspected and repointed as required; all flashing must be inspected and replaced as required; all capstone fittings will be inspected; and the entire chimney needs external repair.

We have entered into a maintenance contract for the HMH boiler as well as signed a contract to keep our oil deliveries at a set price for that property. Both of these contracts are with Down East Energy. A. Maurais & Son will continue to service the church pellet boiler.

The gas stove/oven in the church kitchen has been causing us some difficulty. The latest discovery is that there is a large hornet's nest in the exhaust fan attached to the roof above the church's kitchen. We will have to have this removed, and then we will have to address an electrical problem with the stove/oven functioning correctly.

We apologize for the inconvenience of the lift being out of order but we are seeking to remedy the situation as soon as possible. The doors on the lower level are not functioning and cannot be used but we also are waiting to receive our updated operation license from the state. Thank you for your patience and understanding.


