Important Church Business Meeting


On Sunday, November 4, we will be holding a special business meeting following worship. The Property Trustees have consulted with potential contractors on removing pigeons and other pests from the space above our sanctuary and vestry. The work will also include closing up the spaces where animals are entering, cleaning up the attic, and (since we have to replace the old insulation) installing improved insulation. The cost will be substantial, so the congregation needs to meet in order to authorize the work and to

determine where the money will come from: From our endowment? From a rearrangement of capital campaign priorities? Other? We will discuss these matters on November 4, with a formal Call to Meeting sent out in advance.

The Stewardship Campaign kick-off will be coming soon. Letters for this campaign will be mailed in late October. We appreciate all that our church community does to support our church, its programs, and its wider mission.

Please remember that we are in the second year of a three-year capital campaign. The handicap accessibility project which was our first priority was completed in the spring. The next scheduled project is the brickwork on the north face of the church. The Property Trustees are awaiting up-dated bids for this work. The Capital Campaign fund has a balance of \$60,619.16.

We are currently in the middle of our stewardship campaign. By the time you read this, you will have received your 2019 pledge cards. If you have not yet received a card, please contact me or pick one up from one of the tables in the Narthex. We ask that you return your cards on or before Sunday, November 18. Thank you for your faith filled support of Old South.

Our church is an incredible beacon of light in our community. I was able to stay for the Pancakery one Sunday (if you haven't done this yet, you need to!!!) and sat with a UMF student who just happened to be by herself. After talking for a few minutes, I learned she was on the cheapest meal plan available – 10 meals per week. She said that usually gives her 2 meals per day Monday through Friday. I asked what she did on the weekends and she said mentioned she had a hot plate in her room and it was mostly pasta, sometimes she even purchased sauce. Then I asked if she wanted a take home box and she said, "That would be amazing." So, I went back to the kitchen and asked Arin and Amanda Hilton, who were helping back there, if I could get a take home box. I told them this young lady's situation. Arin said they do take home boxes all the time and would love to do that. They proceeded to give her enough food to take home for 2-3 meals!

All that to say, all of us are needed to make these things happen. We need financial support to buy the food. We need volunteers to help serve. We need **everyone**! In your pledge letter, I challenged our previous pledgers to increase what they do next year. I plan to do the same.

Enjoy your fall season and know that you are loved, you are needed, and you are awesome.




